Happy Doggo (HD) is a foundation made for helping street dogs in need from the streets in Thailand and around the world. It was founded by Niall Harbison from Co. Tyrone. The main goal of HD is to **sterilise (neuter)** the dogs to stop the breeding, therefore trying to decrease the line of helpless dogs on the streets. To date HD has helped:

Feed: 1,000 dogs (daily)

Rehome: 59 dogs (globally)

Rescued: 50,000



HD has 8 CVNR (Capture, neuter, vaccinate & release) partners in Thailand and Southeast Asia. They have relied on them to deliver life-saving sterilisations. They have sterilised 50,000 dogs up to February 2025.



Every day, the HD Team feeds over 800 street dogs across the island of Koh Samui. The best way to keep dogs healthy is to feed them a healthy diet. Meals served in 2024: **295,800**

There are thousands of dogs in Thailand with many conditions such as skin conditions to broken bones. HD land is where Niall brings the sickest dogs, giving them **specialised treatment and care** until they are healthy enough to go back or be adopted.



When HD comes across a dog that has been badly abused, is suffering on the streets, or is simply too young or weak to survive on their own, the HD work to find them a forever home in Thailand or abroad. However, Adoption is not a longterm solution to the street dog problem.
